BARRIO WORKS

Barrio Works is a hands-on workshop designed to create a safe environment for youth to discover and develop skills that will be valuable for them in the marketplace. The programs include a bike shop, a metal shop, and wood working, all designed to develop the youth in technical trade skills, life skills, and inner character. Community involvement through local tradesmen teaching classes, mentoring, and apprenticeship is an important parts of the program. Additionally, parental involvement in the youths' projects will facilitate stronger family ties and stability.



BARRIO BIKES

Because we live in a neighborhood in which bicycles are a major source of transportation, yet always in various states of disrepair, Barrio Bikes' main focus is to educate our youth in the maintenance and repair of bicycles and to provide a location for the community to work on their own bikes. Through this shop, neighborhood Ministries is able provide one more safe place to build dignifying relationships, especially with young men who are looking for a place to fit in.

- Teach basic skills of bicycle repair, maintenance and safety.
- Employ youth from within the community as shop mechanics.

•Re-hab donated bicycles for revenue source by developing our own used bike shop.



- Outfit a functioning shop space with the tools, equipment and supplies necessary for community use.
- Give youth a place to develop mentally, physically and spiritually.
