2. **Kids Life** (Mondays, 6:00-9:00 PM- K-7 graders / Contact: Emily Fankhauser [[emily.fankhauser@nmaz.net](mailto:emily.fankhauser@nmaz.net)], 602-487-1298). *About 450 kids gather to enjoy creative activities, singing, sports, small group sharing, Bible stories and snacks.*
